## Barreduela de la Cruz





La Barreduela de la Cruz begins very close to the Cathedral of Seville and, after a couple of twists and turns, it leads to a small square, which has no other exit.


It is a narrow and winding street, crossed by an overpass that connects the houses on both sides of the alley. The square is secluded with four small orange trees. It is presided over by a 16th-century cross that comes from the San Lázaro hospital, where it would have been placed as a wayside shrine in the early years of the 20th century. Only two or three doorways open to this ensemble.







Despite being a public space, it can be privatized to carry out fashion photography sessions, advertising shoots, film shootings, advertising spots, or events such as a sensory tasting under the blooming orange trees in April, as well as product presentations with a small catering, tasting Sevillian Aljarafe orange wine. Arrivals could be planned in horse-drawn carriages, where guests are already served a glass of cava or manzanilla.







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
