



The Callejuela de la Judería is one of the unique and surprising streets in the center of Seville.

It has a very peculiar layout, crossing under one of the towers of the city wall with a bend in its access, and divided into two sections: the first, in the front, is a dead-end, with a small door at its end, and the second turns to the left and leads to the Santa Cruz neighbourhood, through an arch with iron bars. The street is just over a hundred meters long, and both its role as a connection between the area of the Cathedral and the interior of the neighbourhood, and its peculiar zigzag layout that plays with surprising elements of remarkable architectural beauty, are characteristic of typical and traditional Seville.



This public space must be managed for private use. Shabby&Chic handles the necessary permits to film and/or to host events.


